POT LUCK RECIPES

Crusty Bread Leda Kim

3 c unbleached flour 1 3/4 tsp salt 1/2 tsp yeast 1 1/2 c water

Mix dry ingredients, add water and mix until a shaggy dough results. Cover bowl with plastic wrap and set aside 12-18 hrs. Heat oven to 450. Place an empty cast iron pot with lid (I use a Le Creuset pot) in oven and heat for 30 min. Pour dough on a floured surface and shape in a ball. Cover while pot heats. Remove pot from oven and drop in dough. Cover and bake at 450 for 30 min. Remove cover and bake 15 min. Put on cooling rack.

Even people who don't bake can do this one!
