She lives in Marion in the summer, and her paternal ancestors are Howlands, all from New Bedford.



Letter from Mary O'Keefe regarding the Bells of Remembrance:

I would just like to give a thank you to officers Kathy McAuliffe, Roxanne Bungert and Carole Clifford for their support for the project. A special thank you to the ladies who joined in last year to canvas the South Coast and get 66 churches and municipal buildings. I always felt the memberships' support and I am grateful. This year I sent a personal thank you from our Club and encouraged all who participated last year to continue the tradition and many have responded in the positive. All thanked our Club for our work and idea.

I decided, this year, to try to get the support of the media, radio and TV, both local and Boston stations. I contacted Armed Forces Committees and the Department of Veterans Services groups. I reached out to politicians from President Trump and his re-election committee chairwoman to congressmen and congresswomen and senators, both at their local and DC addresses. I made contact, again, with Mayor Walsh and Governor Baker. In all I made 75-100 contacts, as well as a few new churches on the South Coast.



I hope I represented you proudly and I wait for replies. This will, however, be the last year that I will head up this project. We need the "powers that be" to get involved in order to succeed. I have tried, believe it or not, for 10 years, a time goal I set for myself. I have talked and worked with other groups and people with similar ideas in the United States and Canada. It is something everybody wants but seems beyond our reach to attain.

I certainly encourage anyone who would like to take it over the Bells of Remembrance program to do so but, if not, I know you will all be sure to remember our Vets, in your own personal way, on their special day. Heidrea 4 Heroes will be our new involvement, helping our local Vets, and their families, with the needs they face. I have come to learn that PTSD and suicide are such epidemic problems now that it has to be the main concern of us all to assist the men and women who put life on hold for us. Hopefully the service and the support we give will resonate louder than any bell could have.
