Looking for winter ducks at Silvershell beach


February 1, 2023 8:00 am - 9:30 am


Wednesday, January 11 9:30 am


Knitting & Hand Crafts Thursday, January 26 2:00- 4:00 pm

Great Decisions is "America's largest discussion group on world and domestic affairs."


Each year during our meetings we find the topics are meaningful, current, and offer us ways to research, give our opinions and seek out experts on each issue.
